







Facility Use

Presidents Elementary was project number three of a four-part bond voters approved in March 2000. The building is designed to accommodate 650 students, grades kindergarten through fifth-grade. The school is located in the "Old Town" zone of Arlington, which preserves the historic quality of the traditional town center. The building design takes this intent into account, respecting the historic Roosevelt Building and other surrounds. You are invited to become an active part of our school.

School Improvement Plan

Presidents Elementary houses Developmental Pre-School and our district's special education ASSIST program for students with autism.

All classroom teachers have set targeted SMART goals for improving performance on the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) in mathematics and other district-created assessments, and are using frequent monitoring of both formative and summative assessment data to improve and adjust their teaching strategies to best meet the needs of their learners.

Our second goal centers around improving school culture by providing leadership opportunities for our students. Our staff is fully immersed in implementing the third year of *The Leader in Me* program. This year, we have compiled a student chosen Lighthouse Team and are working to implement Student Action Teams that are comprised of an accurate representation of our population.
