Facility Use

Kent Prairie Elementary opened in 1993 and houses kindergarten through fifth-grade general education classrooms, and a resource room and remedial assistance room. Kent Prairie also houses the district program for K-5 students who need extended resource support. The PTA has added playground equipment over the years. These outdoor areas are also used by the community when school is not in session. The carpet and gym floor were replaced in 2020. You are invited to become an active part of our school.



Student Assessment Result Comparisons

Students took an abbreviated version of the Washington State Smarter Balanced Assessments in fall 2021, which was required by the federal Department of Education. Due to the abbreviated nature of the assessment, there is no comparison data available. Standard state testing will resume in spring 2022.

School Improvement Plan

Kent Prairie learning community members work toward the improvement of academic achievement and social/emotional growth for all students. We use a continuous improvement model as we investigate data sources, set goals, and implement key support strategies. Our staff members continue to enhance their "craft" as they take part in professional development related to student engagement, differentiation, assessment practices, trauma informed practices, and

meeting the needs of students with different goals. As an internationally recognized professional learning community, we continue to collaborate on all curricular areas while promoting a growth mindset for our staff and students. Grade level teams work in concert with special education and remedial support staff, commit to a minimum of one hour per week to collaborate for improving student achievement, reviewing common assessments, and developing interventions and extensions for students.
