Pioneer Elementary opened for the 2002-03 school year. Student Assessment Result Comparisons

Students took an abbreviated version of the Washington State Smarter Balanced Assessments in fall 2021, which was required by the federal Department of Education. Due to the abbreviated nature of the assessment, there is no comparison data available. Standard state testing will resume in spring 2022.

School Improvement Plan

Pioneer staff has focused on supporting our students' social/emotional and academic needs as we have returned to full-time in person learning this school year. All staff have been engaged in professional development and implementation of a school-wide social/emotional curriculum, PurposeFull People. A focus on monthly character traits and creating strong classroom communities with class meetings is being implemented throughout the school. Another focus of professional learning at Pioneer is Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and the principles of firm goals and variability. Teachers are beginning to implement variability within lessons and reflecting on the impact on student learning within their PLC teams and during staff professional learning groups. The intervention team meets weekly and is focused on further developing their understanding of MTSS and UDL and providing teachers with interventions and accommodations for students within tier one. The learning and beginning implementation of the UDL principle, variability supports the continued Inclusionary Practice focus of Pioneer.
