Facility Use

Presidents Elementary was project number three of a four-part bond voters approved in March 2000. The building is designed to accommodate 650 students, grades kindergarten through fifth-grade. The school is located in the "Old Town" zone of Arlington, which preserves the historic quality of the traditional town center. The building design takes this intent into account, respecting the historic Roosevelt

Student Assessment Result Comparisons

Students took an abbreviated version of the Washington State Smarter Balanced Assessments in fall 2021, which was required by the federal Department of Education. Due to the abbreviated nature of the assessment, there is no comparison data available. Standard state testing will resume in spring 2022.
